## **Content and Objectives of the Programme**

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The course pursues the goal of laying in-depth foundations in the subject by scientific study of German language and literature. The studies in German cover these individual points:

- An overview of the history of German literature from the beginnings to the present in the context of the history of European literature, thought and culture
- Fundamentals of evaluation and mediation of literary texts on methodical principles
- Basic knowledge of current and historical theories of literature
- Basic knowledge in the fundamental disciplines rhetoric, poetics/aesthetics, narratology
- Awareness of the problems of a scientific fixing of terminology (epochs, genres, methodologies)
- Competence in reading and translating earlier forms of German
- Awareness of the problem of alterity in medieval literature
- Ability to reflect on literary texts in their artificiality and historical context
- Ability to delineate appropriately contextual relationships in both oral and written forms and using relevant media to present them suitably to a target group
- Fundamental knowledge of the systematic levels of the German language (phonetics/ phonology, graphematics, morphologie, syntax, semantics, pragmatics).
- An overview of the most important historical lines of development in the German language in both the German language (Old High German, Middle High German, Early Modern High German) and in relation to historical sectional views of tendencies in phonetics/phonology, graphematics, morphology, syntax, semantics and pragmatics.
- Developing an awareness of question complexes, investigational methods and theoretical approaches in linguistics
- Basic knowledge of the most important research paradigms in current German linguistics
- Ability to recognise, analyse and reflect on present-day use of language in its various manifestations in the media with the help of a pool of linguistic methods
- Ability to recognise historical texts, to place them chronologically, geographically and socially and to reflect appropriately on their source situation with the help of the available methods of historical linguistics
- Basic knowledge of concepts and methods in presenting German language and literature (didactics)

#### Contents

One of the following sub-modules has to be chosen. The sub-module argumentation and verbalisation concerns the practice of writing: How do I mount an argument? How far does a smart wording distinguish from an awkward one? When does a sentence is not only correct, but also nice and smart? What do you need to know if the intelligibility of a text should be ensured? How does a text receives argumentative density and rhetorical subtlety? The writing will exemplarily be practised on subjects that are relevant to the discipline, for example: How a recension about a subject book is written, how is the discussion of an evening of theatre or a literary novelty is written?; The sub-module recension comprises the practise of the text genre of recension by well-chosen literary texts (generally from authors of today) or by readings (depending on offers). The basis module information literacy, which focuses on information literacy in an academic context, is aimed at students of the humanities. This includes research strategies and tools, dealing with electronical information tools of the library, specific sources of information in the humanities: bibliographies, databases, catalogues, magazines, reference work, internet research and search engines, overview of information tools and literature administration, which students will use during their studies.

#### Intended learning outcomes

Concerning the sub-module argumentation and formulation: Students have the ability to formulate and argue as well as the ability to structure texts; Additionally, they will acquire stylistic, argumentative and structural basic principles of important text and linguistic levels. Concerning the sub-module recension: Students have worked on generic insights into modern literature and have learned how to deal with the text type "recension". Concerning the sub-module information competence to the humanities: Students know which information will be needed for certain purposes. They have the ability to find and evaluate information that are important to their discipline and, additionally, find relevant information in various sources. At the same time, they are particularly familiar with the different qualities of specific information sources (databases) with a limited access and generally accessible information (internet). Moreover, students are able to review, administrate and process the researched information for their individual needs with the help of literature administration programmes and e-learning applications. This module is designed to teach students how to find and deal with the necessary information and literature research for the thesis.
