

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Content and Objectives of the Programme

The BA programme Ancient Near Eastern Studies (Major) introduces students to the principal fields of Ancient Near Eastern studies, teaching them the methodology of Ancient Near Eastern studies and giving them an overview of the ancient Near Eastern languages and cultures. Students learn to read and understand original ancient Near Eastern sources (texts and artefacts) by themselves and to classify them within their historical and cultural context. Students acquire basic, and, for selected areas, in-depth knowledge of the major ancient Near Eastern languages and writing systems.

The BA programme Ancient Near Eastern Studies focuses on a thorough training in ancient Near Eastern languages and scripts (in particular the Mesopotamian cuneiform script), familiarity with ancient Near Eastern texts, basic methodology and a good knowledge of ancient Near Eastern history and culture.

In the BA thesis the graduates have demonstrated their ability to discuss a specific ancient Near Eastern topic according to scholarly standards, using the methodological skills and linguistic competence as well as the historical and cultural knowledge that they have acquired in their studies. While supervised, the BA thesis is fundamentally an independent study project.

The degree is the first degree within a consecutive Bachelor-Master programme. It qualifies for the start of a profession outside academia or for the enrolement in a follow-up MA programme.

The BA programme in Ancient Near Eastern Studies is the first step towards an academic career in Ancient Near Eastern studies at a university or at other research institutions. The BA degree lays the prerequisite foundations for a MA degree as the next step towards a scholarly career. Graduates of this programme also acquire skills for a professional career outside academia or for further training in other fields: e.g., publishing; library services; culture management; media; museums; other professions requiring general skills provided for in this programme of study.

The field of Ancient Near Eastern studies covers a vast variety of textual sources, artefacts and material remains from the various regions of the Middle East stretching over more than 3000 years. Students acquire the methodological competence to familiarize themselves with new and complex topics quickly and efficiently.

Thus the graduate is used to permanent learning and has acquired the methodological skills to develop solutions for new challenges. Students of the BA Ancient Near Eastern Studies are required to read specialized literature in various languages, particularly in English and German, but also in French and Italian; they learn to read difficult texts in languages other than their native language, and to gain the relevant information from them. At the same time, they learn to write texts in academic German.

Studying Ancient Near Eastern studies with success requires a proactive attitude, a strong commitment, great diligence and a high degree of motivation.

ContentsAkkadian, a member of the Semitic family of languages, was the most widespread language of the ancient Ne- ar East. Thus, the student must begin learning the language from the start of the programme. The module gives an introduction to reading Akkadian texts, with special emphasis on the Old Babylonian dialect. Sections of the Code of Hammurabi in Neo-Assyrian cuneiform as well as other selected Old Babylonian texts (documents, let- ters, omens) will be read in class. By means of these text examples, the student will become familiar with the cu- neiform signs as well as with Old Babylonian cursive. On the basis of the texts, the student will also develop a knowledge of Old Babylonian history, especially the history of society and of law.Intended learning outcomesThe student will acquire detailed knowledge of the structure of Akkadian and will be able to use this knowledge to independently read Akkadian texts. He/she will be able to transliterate, transcribe and translate texts from the Code of Hammurabi and other selected Old Babylonian texts and to give a grammatical analysis of these. In ad- dition to the Neo-Assyrian form of cuneiform, the student will know the elementary signs of the Old Babylonian cursive and monumental script. He/she will be familiar with Old Babylonian history and, in particular, the history of society and law.


