#### Wissenschaftliche Befähigung

- Die Studierenden können wichtige Vertreter der Religionswissenschaft benennen, die Inhalte verschiedener religionswissenschaftlicher Disziplinen beschreiben und die grundlegenden Methoden anwenden.
