Students will be introduced to an essential sub-area of Latin Philology. In this context, they will be introduced to interpretation methods, elements of text analysis and literary historical coherences; Students get an overview of intellectual and cultural backgrounds; They will gain insights into tradition history and history of literary reception. They will translate important, not too challenging texts from the area of Latin poetry into German; Thus, repetition of significant units of school grammar, discussion of metric phenomena, instruction to historical linguistic and stylised text analysis, introduction to different interpretations methods will be covered. Students will systematically be introduced to the field of Latin metrics: discussion of basic terms; presentation of different metric types; practise of the most important verse metres; explanations of the logical function of metrics; introduction to the appearance of the prose rhythm.

Intended learning outcomes

Students get an overview of Latin literature in their genres; They are able to interpret important works of Latin authors; They have knowledge of important sections of Roman literary history; They are familiar with cultural-historical backgrounds. Students are expected to possess the school grammar; They have basic knowledge in the field of language history and historical grammar; They are familiar with fundamental methods of text analysis and interpretation of texts. Students are sure in determining and analysing of most frequent metric forms; They are able to make metric phenomena subject to text interpretation.

In this context, they will be introduced to interpretation methods, elements of text analysis and literary historical coherences; They will get an overview of intellectual and cultural backgrounds; The students will be introduced to tradition history and history of literary reception. They will translate important, not too challenging texts from the area of Latin prose into German; Thus, repetition of significant units of school grammar, discussion of metric phenomena, instruction to historical linguistic and stylised text analysis, introduction to different interpretations methods will be covered.
