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## Content and Objectives of the Programme

The certificate program Detecting and preventing abuse of power (MEV) is offered by the Faculty of Human Sciences together with the Faculty of Catholic Theology and Faculty of Medicine of JMU as further education study program according to article 78 paragraph 1, sentence 2, no. 2, letter b) BayHIG and is aimed at teachers in public schools and other professionals who wish to further their education in accordance with Art. 78 BayHIG, who are active in hierarchical structures, care for others and can act as multipliers..

The aim of the certificate program is to impart skills to students and employees, as well as to those working in relevant contexts, which will enable them to recognize, competently assess, and appropriately respond to abusive behavior and psychological, physical, and sexual violence in their current or future fields of practice and career.

Based on the study programme, the faculties named in the first sentence will issue a certificate for the certificate programme Detecting and preventing abuse of power (MEV) after all required module achievements have been completed in accordance with this FSB.

The basics are taught and specific examples on the subject of abuse of power are introduced. The initial theoretical knowledge is deepened and consolidated with corresponding exercises. Abuse of power is first defined and examined from various professional perspectives (psychological, sociological), and relevant research is summarized. Legal aspects and key points of protection concepts are presented. The role of the media is addressed and the ecclesiastical and university dimensions are discussed. The perspective of those affected, vulnerability and the consequences of abuse of power are further topics.
