## Learning Outcomes

### Wissenschaftliche Befähigung

- Die Absolvent\*innen können aktuelle und innovative museumswissenschaftliche Theorien, Methoden, Forschungsansätze und Entwicklungstendenzen im Museums- und Ausstellungswesen anwenden und reflektieren und verfügen über einen fundierten Einblick in zukunftsweisende Arbeitsfelder. Unter Berücksichtigung internationaler Entwicklungen und des Leitmotivs eines besucherzentrierten, sozial inklusiven Museums liegt ein besonderer Schwerpunkt auf dem Exponieren, Kuratieren und Vermitteln. Dabei werden die Studierenden befähigt, eigenständig neue Forschungsfragen zu entwerfen, auf einer begründeten methodischen Basis praxistaugliche Lösungen zu entwickeln und sich mit aktuellen Fragestellungen des interdisziplinär ausgerichteten Fachs in aller Breite und Tiefe auseinanderzusetzen. Absolvent\*innen mit sehr gutem bis gutem MA-Abschluss haben die Möglichkeit, eine Promotion in "Museumswissenschaft / Museum Studies" in Würzburg anzufertigen.
- Die Absolvent\*innen beherrschen das selbstständige wissenschaftlichen Arbeiten mit entsprechenden Urteils- und Problemlösungsfähigkeiten auf einem fortgeschrittenen Niveau. Sie sind in der vertieften Recherche, Verdichtung, Strukturierung und Vermittlung von Informationen geübt. Sie verfügen über die Fähigkeit, zu neuen Themen Forschungsfragen zu entwickeln, geeignete Methoden auszuwählen und Aufgaben fristgerecht zu bearbeiten. Dabei können sie sich in unvertraute Arbeitsgebiete selbstständig und kritisch einarbeiten.
- Die Absolvent\*innen können komplexe, neue und bis dato nicht vertraute Problemzusammenhänge in mündlicher wie schriftlicher Form sachgerecht aufbereiten sowie museal und medial zielgruppenspezifisch vermitteln und kommunizieren. Sie beherrschen den sicheren Umgang mit modernen Präsentations-, Moderations- und Informationstechnologien.
- Die Absolvent\*innen verfügen über ein reflektiertes Wissen hinsichtlich internationaler und zukunftsweisender Forschungsdebatten. Sie sind mit den Forschungsschwerpunkten der Museologie in Würzburg vertraut.

### Befähigung zur Aufnahme einer qualifizierten Erwerbstätigkeit

- Die Absolvent\*innen sind für eine wissenschaftliche Laufbahn im Museums- und Ausstellungssektor, in vergleichbaren Kultureinrichtungen (Ausstellungshäuser, Galerien, Gedenkstätten, Heritage Sites etc.) oder in öffentlichen Museumsberatungsstellen qualifiziert und in der Lage, ihr berufliche Tätigkeit zu reflektieren und weiterzuentwickeln. Ergänzend kommen eine freiberufliche wissenschaftliche Tätigkeit in der privatwirtschaftlichen Museumsberatung, in Ausstellungs- und Mediengestaltung, aber auch eine Laufbahn im Bereich der akademischen Museumsausbildung und Museumsforschung in Betracht. Je nach gewählter Fächerkombination und Schwerpunktsetzung befähigt das Studium überdies für Tätigkeiten, bei denen es um die wissenschaftlich reflektierte Präsentation und das Management kultureller Dienstleistungen geht oder bei denen Kommunikations- und Informationskompetenzen gefragt sind.
- Durch die kontinuierliche Zusammenarbeit der Würzburger Museologie mit Museen und anderen Kultureinrichtungen können sich die Studierenden mit potenziellen Arbeitgebern im Ausstellungs-, Museums- und Kultursektor vernetzen.
- Die Absolvent\*innen sind in der Lage, konstruktiv und zielorientiert in heterogenen Teams (Arbeitsgruppen) zusammenzuarbeiten, unterschiedliche Ansichten zu reflektieren und produktiv zur Zielerreichung zu nutzen und mögliche Konflikte zu bearbeiten. Sie können eine Aufgabe nicht nur aus wissenschaftlicher Sicht, sondern auch unter Einbezug der finanziellen und personellen Ressourcen des Praxispartners sowie unter Einbezug der Erwartungen und Bedürfnisse der Zielgruppen unter Zeit- und Erfolgsdruck umsetzen. Dabei setzen sich die Studierenden auch mit organisatorischen und gesellschaftlichen Aspekten auseinander.

- Die Absolvent\*innen haben einen vertieften Einblick in internationale Entwicklungen im Museums- und Ausstellungswesen. Im Rahmen eines Praktikums im Ausland oder eines fakultativen Auslandssemesters werden weitere fachliche und berufsqualifizierende Kompetenzen erworben - da Museen ein weltweites Phänomen sind, verbessert ein Auslandsaufenthalt ihre Berufschancen und weitet ihren museologischen Blick.

#### **Befähigung zum gesellschaftlichen Engagement**

- Die Projektlehre (s.o.) der Würzburger Museologie folgt dem Service Learning-Gedanken. Die Studierenden besuchen dabei regelmäßig Lehrveranstaltungen ("Learning") und leisten in deren Rahmen einen gemeinnützigen Dienst ("Service"), indem sie hier ein konkretes Ergebnis erarbeiten, das den involvierten Praxispartnern zur Verfügung gestellt wird. Dieser Service wird so ausgewählt, dass praktische Aspekte des theoretischen Seminarinhalts aufgegriffen werden, um theoretische wie berufspraktische Kompetenzen zu vermitteln. Die Lernenden übernehmen dadurch gesellschaftliche und ethische Verantwortung für Andere und verarbeiten anschaulicher und besser die fachlichen Inhalte. Dabei fördert Service Learning sowohl den Praxisbezug der universitären Lehre als auch die Partizipation von Studierenden an der demokratischen Gestaltung des öffentlichen Lebens: Die Studierenden arbeiten in Teilprojekten, die erst im Zusammenwirken das öffentlich präsentierte Gesamtergebnis ausmachen.

#### **Persönlichkeitsentwicklung**

- Die Absolvent\*innen verfügen über fortgeschrittene diskursive Fähigkeiten, über Team-, Kontakt- und Kritikfähigkeit, sie können selbstständig, selbstverantwortlich, proaktiv sowie zielorientiert arbeiten und dabei ihr fachliches Wissen reflektiert in neuen Kontexten anwenden.
- Absolvent\*innen erwerben im Rahmen eines Auslandsaufenthalts interkulturelle Kompetenzen, können diese in unterschiedlichen interkulturellen Kontexten anwenden und sich in einem heterogenen Umfeld bewegen.

This module focuses on visitor-centred approaches to museum work. Based on the theoretical considerations of social inclusion (Richard Sandell), the opening of museums to all milieus and social groups (keyword diversity) as well as participative and self-reflective museum work are dealt with, but also the strategic development of target groups. Best practice examples will be discussed and ideas for your own implementation options developed. An additional focus is on current research in the sense of a theoretical foundation for museum practice.

Students are familiar with different theoretical approaches and methodologies and are able to put them into practice in museums. This transfer of practice and theory generates a gain in professional competences in addition to academic knowledge.

The module offers theory-based insights into the large, diverse area of "cultural heritage" - whereby aspects of identity formation, collective memory, history and cultural policy are also taken into account - and provides in-depth knowledge from various thematic sub-areas. There is a fundamental focus on the aspect of the creation of cultural heritage (heritagification) as well as the respective mechanisms, actors and interests behind it.		
<b>Intended learning outcomes</b>		
Students are able to recognise that "cultural heritage" is not something that exists per se, but something that has been created. They can critically reflect on who, at what time and for what reasons, has an interest in declaring a certain object as "cultural heritage" and in preserving, changing or destroying this "heritage".
