Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives

The course specification for the Bachelor programme in Political and Social Studies provides for an interdisciplinary and multifunctional course in Social Sciences combining fundamental qualifications in scientific research with further competences in analysis and special methods. Students acquire a sound knowledge of Political Theory and Political Philosophy, Comparative Politics and Governance, International Relations, Security, Peace and Conflict Studies, Social Theory, Social Stratification and other specific subfields of Sociology. Further competences include methodological knowledge (statistical literacy) and practical skills of empirical social research, statistics, data collection and multivariate data analysis in the Social Sciences.

The course objective of the Bachelor programme in Political and Social Studies is to enable students to be successful in meeting political, social and in particular career-orientated challenges.
