## Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives

The course specification for the Bachelor programme in Political and Social Studies provides for an interdisciplinary and multifunctional course in Social Sciences combining fundamental qualifications in scientific research with further competences in analysis and special methods. Students acquire a sound knowledge of Political Theory and Political Philosophy, Comparative Politics and Governance, International Relations, Security, Peace and Conflict Studies, Social Theory, Social Stratification and other specific subfields of Sociology. Further competences include methodological knowledge (statistical literacy) and practical skills of empirical social research, statistics, data collection and multivariate data analysis in the Social Sciences.

The course objective of the Bachelor programme in Political and Social Studies is to enable students to be successful in meeting political, social and in particular career-orientated challenges.

Based on a number of macroeconomic models (AS/AD, IS/LM, phillips curve, labor market equilibria, Solow model, Beveridge curve, etc.), students study the ability of the state to influence national and global economies. Students learn to assess in which situations such influence can be welfare-enhancing and under which circumstances governmental interventions may be harmful. After successful completion of the course, students are able to analyze concrete economic situations and to develop policy options of the state. In addition, students have learned to assess the situation of a country on the basis of empirical macroeconomic data and to explain the particular problems based on different models.</p>

Number of places: 405. No restrictions with regard to available places for Bachelor's students of Wirtschaftswissenschaft (Business Management and Economics), Wirtschaftsmathematik (Mathematics for Economics) and Wirtschaftsinformatik (Business Information Systems). The remaining places will be allocated to students of other subjects. Should the number of applications exceed the number of available places, places will be allocated in a standardised procedure among all applicants irrespective of their subjects according to the following quotas: Quota 1 (50% of places): total number of ECTS credits already achieved in the respective degree subject; among applicants with the same number of ECTS credits achieved, places will be allocated by lot. Quota 2 (25% of places): number of subject semesters of the respective applicant; among applicants with the same number of subject semesters, places will be allocated by lot. Quota 3 (25% of places): allocation by lot. Applicants who already have successfully completed at least one module component of the respective module will be given preferential consideration. Places on all courses of the module component with a restricted number of places will be allocated in the same procedure. A waiting list will be maintained and places re-allocated as they become available.
