Intended learning outcomes

In the field of teaching methodology, students acquire fundamental knowledge of subject-specific teaching-learning processes in the didactic sub-discipline (language, literature and media didactics). During the seminar and on the basis of associated reading matter, students will be familiar with current problem areas and tasks, which are necessary for professional skills in order to plan, implement and reflect an own lesson, of a contemporary German classes. In doing so and in terms of increasing self-competence, the students develop a basic understanding of a theory-driven, practice-oriented, subject related and in pedagogical contexts involved instructional dealing. From the acquired professional skills, students develop during the school like specific tutorial, specific and class-related criteria and planning parameters. Hence, they consolidate the technical knowledge in reference to specific extracts of professional dealing in class. Moreover, they expand their self-competences in terms of planning, presenting and evaluating lesson sequences, according to collectively developed criteria. In doing so, they also expand their methodically action repertoire both concerning the communication and interaction forms and concerning practical teaching field of action. Students are capable to cover academic texts appropriately and correctly and to apply their own experiences and knowledge to the own text production. They possess intercultural competence in relevant speaking situations.
