#### **Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives**

The Literature, Culture and Media programme leading to the degree of Master of Arts (MA) is offered by the Faculty of Arts, Historical, Philological, Cultural and Geographical Studies of JMU as a research-based course in the framework of a consecutive Bachelor's/Master's model.

The course pursues the goal of imparting in-depth skills in the areas of literature, cultural studies and media studies, particularly at their intersections. Connections and interactions between the literatures, cultures and media that are dealt with by the subjects involved in the course should be conveyed and made the starting point for in-depth analysis.

The Literature, Culture and Media course can either be completed entirely in German or, in whole or in part, in the language of one or more of the philologies involved in the course.
