They demonstrate outstanding ability to become acquainted with the complexity of different thematic fields and to methodically conceive and organize them in a way that enables the creation of didactical arrangements of teaching and learning.

This acquired professional knowledge, competences and methodologies qualifies graduates for scientific work and for the critical reflection of scientific knowledge/results at a high academic level.
