### **Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives**

The degree subject Indology is offered by the Faculty of Arts of JMU in the framework of a programme that combines a major and a minor and focuses on the fundamental principles of the two disciplines. Which degree is awarded to a graduate depends on his or her major.

Indology is a discipline that primarily uses historical and philological approaches to investigate the Indian cultural area on the basis of the available sources. Students of Indology get equipped with knowledge and skills in the most important branches of Indology and get trained in the methods typically used in the discipline. Developing a knowledge of Sanskrit, one of the classical languages of India, is an essential element of the students' training. Equipped with discipline-specific knowledge and skills as well as interpersonal and communication skills, graduates from Indology are well prepared for a wide variety of careers. They will be able to quickly familiarise themselves with, and work in, a wide range of fields. Studying Indology at Bachelor's degree level at the University of Würzburg, students

- gain an overview of the languages and literatures of the Indian subcontinent as well as facts about the intellectual and cultural history of the subcontinent from antiquity to the present day,
- develop sound reading and translation skills in Sanskrit, one of the classical languages of India, and its script
- gain a grounding in the research methods typically used in Indology,
- develop an awareness of the specific characteristics of Indian literatures, cultural traditions and the society rooted in them,
- learn some essential methods for the analysis of literary, theological and philosophical texts in their original language,
- develop the ability to appropriately delineate problems, both verbally and in writing, and to present them using media support in a suitable manner to a target group.
