Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives

Catholic Theology as minor subject introduces the basic principles of theology, i.e. historical, biblical, systematic and practical theology. Students gain an overview of the fundamental connections in theological thinking. They receive basic knowledge of scientific methods and attain insight into the current research in two sub-areas of theology. In addition to the mandatory courses students are free to select additional courses depending on their interest.
