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Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives

The Bachelor programme Musicology imparts fundamental scientific knowledge, familiarity with the most important methods in the subject and practice-related skills. Students acquire a broadly-based foundation in the areas of earlier and modern music history, music and media, ethnomusicology, systematic musicology, music theory and applied musicology. They furthermore obtain a wider qualification, in the sense of optional individual emphases, in a selection of the fields named. Graduates of this course of studies are equipped for a spectrum of activities in the field of media, music publishing and scientifically-based cultural activities. At the same time, the programme provides a qualification for a wide range of Master programmes in music, culture and media.

Conten					
The module provides the students with the basics of musicological thinking. In the context of the Humanities, Cultural Studies, Social and Natural Sciences, Musicology studies the diverse physiological, acoustic, ideal, historical and regional conditions, phenomena and forms of music. The diversity of musical forms at all historical stages and in all cultures requires not only for a rationally founded order of phenomena, but also for a pragmatic fragmentation of the wealth of subject matter. This need is reflected in the internal disciplinary division into four interlinked areas of work. These are characterised by their fundamental questions: Historical Musicology by the question of the emergence and development of musical processes, Systematic Musicology by the question of the physiological, acoustic and sociological basics of music, music education by the question of conveying practical and theoretical knowledge of music, and Ethnomusicology by the question of the forms of musical expression, functions and structures of musical phenomena, which means that the internal subjects have a centripetal rather than a centrifugal effect.
