Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives

The programme in this course of study aims at inducting the student into the main fields of Pre- and Protohistoric Archaeology and is designed for imparting the methodology of archaeological work and overviewing the cultural groups in Europe during pre- and protohistoric times.

In preparing a thesis the graduate has demonstrated his/her capability of pursuing scheduled academic work on a fixed topic and to deal with a specific problem in the field of Pre- and Protohistoric Archaeology under instruction, but mostly independently, by applying learnt methods and scientific viewpoints.

The examination enables the candidate to earn a degree in the field of Pre- and Protohistoric Archaeology that is internationally compatible and in the course of a consecutive Bachelor-Master degrees study programme constitutes a first academic degree qualifying the graduate for professional career entry or application for admission for subsequent Master Studies. The examination is designed for asserting that the candidate is acquainted with the coherent basic study programme in Pre- and Protohistoric Archaeology and capable of handling the methodological requirements of the academic discipline.

The study programme is primarily designed for education for occupation as Pre- and Protohistoric Archaeologist in a university, other research institutions, archaeological heritage services or museums. To this aim the Bachelor degree lays the basis for the Master degree allowing further qualification for scientific occupation. In addition this study programme also qualifies the graduate for professional career entry in fields beyond a scientific occupation, e.g. publishing, librarianship, cultural administration, media, tourism, museology, PR, diplomacy.

The module provides students with an overview of the Ancient Egypt history from the beginnings in the prehistory and early history with the result of an Egyptian state up to the late period and the final stage of political independence of Egypt in the era of the Hellenism and Roman Empire, primarily from Egyptian sources. Overview of the epochal structuring of Egyptian history. Next to specific contents of the courses, the module will focus on the methodology concerning the dealing with Egyptian sources and source criticism.

Intended learning outcomes

Students have an overview of the historical events of Egypt and have basic knowledge of the historico-cultural characteristics of the individual epochs. They are aware of the purport of Egyptian sources and are able to classify their tendency. They are able to critically evaluate different scientific theories of Egyptian history.

Finally, a simple text will be read in Hieroglyphs.

The module provides students with skills of the Egyptian art history and monumental knowledge. Be it the area of architecture, plastics, relief art or painting, some typical issues of the Egyptian art history are covered in detail in the offered courses. Thus, questions of the iconography will be discussed. Skills of the Egyptian language are not required for courses of this module, but would be desirable. A part of the module can be a trip to an Egyptian collection or to Egypt.

Intended learning outcomes

Students have an overview of facts, research issues and technical literature concerning the Egyptian history of art. They acquire monumental skills and the ability to critically regard the technical literature. They are familiar with the stylised development of Egyptian art in its fundamental principles. They are able to correctly interpret the most important iconographic features of Egyptian art.

Akkadian, which belongs to the Semitic family of languages, was the most widespread language of the ancient Near East. Thus, the student must begin learning the language from the start of the programme. This module provides the student with an overview of the writing systems and languages of the ancient Near East and acquaints them with the fundamental principles of scholarly work. The module introduces the student to cuneiform as well as to Akkadian grammar and vocabulary, with special emphasis on the Old Babylonian dialect.

The student will become familiar with the structure of the Akkadian language and especially with the criteria necessary for the analysis of forms.

This module gives an overview of the history of ancient Western Asia from the beginnings of "civilisation" in southern Mesopotamia in the middle of the 4th millennium BC to the end of the Neo-Babylonian empire in 539 BC. Hittite, which is the earliest attested language of the Indo-European family of languages, was written in Babylonian cuneiform. The module gives an introduction to the grammar and vocabulary of the Hittite language as well as the cuneiform in which it was written, and reinforces the acquired knowledge with the reading of simple Hittite historical texts.

The Sumerian language, which is not related to any other known language, is the oldest written language of the ancient Near East. 
