Religion and lifestyle; religious norms and values; the influence religion exerts on personal, social, and legal matters.

# **Intended learning outcomes**

Students recognise the connection between religion and lifestyle as well as social norms. They are able to describe fundamental normative aspects of world religions. They are able to form a critical opinion about the role of religions in the personal, political, legal, social, and economic spheres.
