This program of study is designed to prepare students for a wide range of employment opportunities upon completion of the degree. As a first job-qualifying degree, the Bachelor »English and American Studies« responds to the demands of today's working environment as many professional fields require a sophisticated knowledge and understanding of languages as well as highly developed cultural and academic competences. - methodologies of and approaches to literary and cultural studies and linguistics,
- analytical as well as research skills and familiarization with linguistic and/or literary and cultural developments specific to the English-speaking world,
- fundamental aspects of linguistics (e.g. syntax, morphology, semantics, pragmatics, phonology, phonetics),
- fundamental aspects of English and North American literature, including their historical and cultural backgrounds.
