### **Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives**

The aim of the training in this course of studies is to make the student familiar with selected sub-areas of Classical Archaeology, to develop competence in the methods of Classical Archaeology and to give an overview of the culture of the Greco-Roman world.

In the Bachelor programme Classical Archaeology, the primary focus is on solid knowledge of fundamentals, methodical competence and appreciation of life in the world of Greek and Roman antiquity. The acquisition of specialised knowledge in sub-areas of antiquity is of secondary importance.

Students gain first insights into the Egyptian grammar and the basic vocabulary of the Middle Egyptian Language. They are able to read simple hieroglyphic texts in the original Egyptian language by using basic tools.

In this module, the student will develop a sound basic knowledge of the Turkish language. Turkish language skills are not only important for numerous practical purposes (working with Turkish-born persons in Germany). A knowledge of Turkish, an agglutinative language, will also be of advantage when learning the Non-Indo-European languages of the ancient Near East. In addition, Turkish language skills are required for Hittitologists to be able to work in the country of origin of Hittite texts.
