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Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives

The Bachelor programme Auxiliary Historical Disciplines as a secondary subject (60 ECTS) has the following individual focal points:

- specialist historical knowledge from all historical epochs
- additional knowledge of special topics from the history of antiquity and medieval times as well as medieval regional history
- an overview of the fundamental relationships within the auxiliary disciplines for history as well as the points of contact with affiliated disciplines, in particular the study of history, classical philology, earlier German history, archaeology and the history of art
- deeper knowledge of the treatment of original sources, their interpretation and of the methods of the auxiliary disciplines for history
- the ability to communicate ideas and problems in history studies, whether with colleagues with the same background or with a broad, historically-interested public

Graduates are equipped to find orientation flexibly in a wide range of task areas and are therefore suited to numerous career fields. Depending on the main subject chosen, one should mention here in particular the education sector and the communication of cultural knowledge and history in the broadest sense as well as, for example, the areas of tourism, museums, media, publishing and industry.

Contents

This module equips students with fundamental knowledge about ancient history. It provides an overview of ancient history and discusses selected examples. The courses explore key problems in and sources of ancient history.

Intended learning outcomes

Students gain an overview of major developments in ancient history and consolidate their knowledge of one or more themes or periods, taking a range of aspects into account (e. g. politics, the economy, society, culture, ideas, or mentalities). They are able to consider this/these theme(s) or period(s) in a general historical context and to identify interdependencies. Students are able to take aspects of the history of Europe and beyond into account. They are able to select and employ appropriate tools and methods. Students are able to critically analyse and interpret sources and academic literature as well as to present their findings in an appropriate manner.
