### **Learning Outcomes**

#### Wissenschaftliche Befähigung

- Die Studierenden können wichtige Vertreter der Religionswissenschaft benennen, die Inhalte verschiedener religionswissenschaftlicher Disziplinen beschreiben und die grundlegenden Methoden anwenden.
- Die Studierenden können Inhalte und Geschichte einzelner Religionen in ihren Grundzügen darstellen. Sie können religionshistorische Arbeitsweisen beschreiben und anwenden. Sie besitzen die Fähigkeit sich mit den Inhalten von Religionen und deren historischen, kulturellen und sozialen Kontexten auseinanderzusetzen.
- Die Studierenden können spezielle Fragestellungen von ausgewählten Religionen in historischer und/oder systematischer Hinsicht untersuchen. Sie sind in der Lage unterschiedliche methodische Zugänge zu bewerten. Sie können das gegenwärtige Selbstverständnis einer Religion mit ihrer historischen Entwicklung in Beziehung setzen.
- Die Studierenden haben Einblick in die Arbeitsweise verschiedener Fachkulturen und können unterschiedliche methodische Zugänge einordnen und auf spezielle Fragestellungen anwenden.
- Die Studierenden können die Rolle von Religion in modernen Gesellschaften analysieren und beurteilen. Sie können innerhalb neureligiöser Strömungen differenzieren.
- Die Studierenden können religionssystematische Fragestellungen erkennen und in Ansätzen selbstständig bearbeiten. Sie können wichtige theoretische Modelle beschreiben und reflektieren.
- Die Studierenden können Methodik und Theoriebildung kulturwissenschaftlicher Forschung philosophisch-systematisch reflektieren und diskutieren. Sie können einen Transfer zwischen verschiedenen Wissenschaftsdisziplinen leisten.
- Sie besitzen die Kompetenz, die Bedeutung von Religion philosophisch-systematisch zu reflektieren, Pro und Contra Argumente zu analysieren und zu bewerten.
- Die Studierenden können den Zusammenhang von Religion und Lebensführung sowie gesellschaftlichen Normen erkennen. Sie können grundlegende normative Inhalte von Weltreligionen beschreiben. Sie können die Rolle von Religionen im persönlichen, politischen, rechtlichen, sozialen und wirtschaftlichen Bereich kritisch beurteilen.
- Die Studierenden können wichtige Epochen der Philosophiegeschichte beschreiben. Sie können grundlegende Probleme und Positionen der Praktischen Philosophie sowie der Theoretischen Philosophie wiedergeben und bewerten. Sie können philosophische Texte und Sachverhalte analysieren und deren Argumente eigenständig wiedergeben und diskutieren.
- Die Studierenden haben die Fertigkeit zur Einhaltung wiss. Arbeitstechniken erworben und können wissenschaftliche Sachverhalte angemessen darstellen. Sie können ein begrenztes Thema strukturieren, sprachlich differenziert darstellen, eigenständig Literatur recherchieren, bewerten und für ihre Darstellung angemessen berücksichtigen.

#### Befähigung, eine qualifizierte Erwerbstätigkeit aufzunehmen

Die Absolvent/innen können im beruflichen Kontext den Transfer der von ihnen erworbenen wissenschaftlichen Methoden auf ihnen unbekannte Praxisfelder und Probleme in fremden Fachgebieten leisten. Sie sind z.B. dazu in der Lage, komplexe Themen, Texte und Problemfelder zu erfassen, diese nach ethischen und kulturspezifischen Gesichtspunkten zu bewerten und Ihren Standpunkt klar zu formulieren. Zudem können die Absolvent/innen Probleme und Lösungsansätze zielgruppengerecht und praxisrelevant aufbereiten und darstellen.



- Sie besitzen die Fähigkeit zur Anwendung religions- und kulturwissenschaftlicher Methoden. Zur selbständigen Planung, Durchführung und Präsentation von geisteswissenschaftlichen Projekten. Sie können Projekte in einem Team organisieren, entscheiden und präsentieren.
- Die Studierenden haben einen Einblick in ein Berufsfeld, den sie in einer Kurzdarstellung reflektieren. Sie können einen begrenzten Arbeitsbereich eigenständig organisieren.
- Sie besitzen die Fähigkeit einen interreligiösen / interkulturellen Dialog zu führen.
- Sie sind in der Lage in öffentlichen Institutionen im Hinblick auf Inhalte, kulturelle Praxis und normative Präferenzen verschiedener Religionen beratend tätig zu sein.

#### Befähigung zum zivilgesellschaftlichen Engagement

- Die Absolvent/innen können soziale, kulturelle und religiöse Entwicklungen kritisch reflektieren und deren Auswirkungen auf die Gesellschaft erfassen. Sie besitzen die Fähigkeit, Themen und Problemfelder in übergeordnete historische, soziale und politische Zusammenhänge einzuordnen und vor diesem Hintergrund begründet Position zu beziehen.
- Die Absolvent/innen können die historischen Ursprünge und ideengeschichtlichen Wurzeln von Kultur und Religion reflektieren. Sie besitzen die Kenntnis und die Fähigkeit zur Kritik von Grundannahmen in Weltbildern.

Sie sind dazu in der Lage, sich unter Einbezug verschiedener Standpunkte eine eigene Meinung zu bilden und diese selbstbewusst gegenüber anderen Menschen zu artikulieren und zu vertreten. Die Absolvent/innen haben gelernt, konstruktive Kritik von anderen Personen anzunehmen und selbstkritisch die eigenen normativen Präferenzen und religiösen Einstellungen zu hinterfragen.
- Die Absolvent/innen haben gelernt, Menschen verschiedener Religionen und Kulturen respektvoll zu begegnen, interkulturell und interreligiös offen zu sein, sich dabei aber auch der eigenen traditionellen Verortung bewusst zu sein.


