Wissenschaftliche Befähigung

- Die Absolventen/-innen haben einen grundlegenden Überblick über die Zusammenhänge und ein Verständnis für die Fachkultur(en) der Theologie als einem Vielfächerstudium mit enzyklopädischem Charakter. Sie verfügen über grundlegende Kenntnisse der Methoden und Fragestellungen in den einzelnen Teilgebieten und Fächern der Theologie (Biblische Theologie; Historische Theologie; Dogmatik und Fundamentaltheologie; Ethik, Liturgie und Kirchenrecht; Pastoraltheologie und Religionspädagogik).
- Die Absolventen/-innen haben ihre Kenntnisse in drei ausgewählten Einzeldisziplinen aus den Teilbereichen der Historischen, Biblischen, Systematischen und Praktischen Theologie sowie der Philosophie anhand exemplarischer fachspezifischer Themen erweitert. Sie kennen die jeweiligen Methoden, Arbeitsweisen und Fragestellungen und können diese ansatzweise auf weitere fachspezifische Themenfelder anwenden. Sie sind in der Lage, ausgewählte Themenkomplexe mit wissenschaftlicher Methode auszuarbeiten und die erzielten Ergebnisse in angemessener Weise darzulegen.
- Die Absolventen/-innen verfügen über einen vertieften Einblick und erweiterte Kenntnisse in dem als Schwerpunktstudium aus dem Gesamtbereich der Theologie gewählten Fach. Sie sind mit dessen methodischen Grundlagen und Arbeitsweisen vertraut und in der Lage, diese auf weitere Themenfelder des Schwerpunktfachs anzuwenden. Sie können sich mit speziellen Themen und aktuellen Fragestellungen auf wissenschaftlichem Niveau sachgerecht und kritisch auseinandersetzen und den eigenen, reflektierten Standpunkt begründen und kommunizieren. Sie sind zur eigenständigen wissenschaftlichen Beschäftigung mit Fragestellungen der Theologie bereit und in der Lage, das im Studium erworbene Wissen selbstständig und sachgerecht anzuwenden und zu erweitern.
- Die Absolventen/-innen sind zur kritischen und differenzierten Urteilsbildung und Problemlösung in aktuellen religiösen und kirchlichen, aber auch politischen und gesellschaftlichen Prozessen auf der Basis reflektierter christlicher Leitideen befähigt.
- Die Absolventen/-innen sind in der Lage, ein Thema aus dem Gegenstandsbereich des Hauptfaches Theologische Studien unter Heranziehung wissenschaftlicher Literatur und Anwendung der erforderlichen Methoden in einem begrenzten Zeitraum selbstständig zu bearbeiten und schriftlich darzustellen.
- Die Absolventen/-innen verfügen über weitere ausgewählte fachspezifische Schlüsselqualifikationen wie Informations- bzw. Methodenkompetenz im Bereich der Theologie, Sprachkenntnisse in biblischen bzw. Kirchensprachen, Einblicke in spezielle Themen und Fragestellungen der Biblischen, Historischen, Systematischen und/oder Praktischen Theologie, Kompetenzen in Homiletik, in Pastoralpsychologie und/oder im interdisziplinären Dialog.

Befähigung, eine qualifizierte Erwerbstätigkeit aufzunehmen

- Die Absolventen/-innen haben sich in einem oder zwei Berufsfeldern von Theologen orientiert und sind fähig, theoretisches Wissen in der Praxis anzuwenden und die erworbenen persönlichen, theologischen und methodischen Kompetenzen sowie die möglichen Arbeitsfelder selbst kritisch zu reflektieren.
- Die Absolventen/-innen sind aufgrund ihrer Fächerkombination mit einem weiteren geistes- oder sozialwissenschaftlichen Hauptfach für vielfältige – auch nicht spezifisch kirchlich-theologische – berufliche Tätigkeitsfelder qualifiziert, in denen Kompetenzen in beiden Bachelor-Studienfächern gefordert oder förderlich sind. Zudem sind sie grundsätzlich zur Aufnahme eines postgradualen, insbesondere Master-Studiums berechtigt.
