Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives

Students of Digital Humanities learn the application of computer-supported procedures and the systematic use of digital resources in humanities and cultural sciences. This subject has an interdisciplinary orientation, and its representatives are distinguished by a traditional training in humanities and cultural sciences as well as by their familiarity with a series of relevant concepts, procedures and standards in information technology.

Typical research and work areas include:

- digital editions and corpora
- formal modelling of knowledge in humanities and cultural sciences
- quantitative text analysis
- visualisation of complex of data structures
- information retrieval, especially in complex data structures
- theories on digital media

Graduates of the Bachelor main subject programme Digital Humanities (acquisition of 85 ECTS) possess practical knowledge of digital procedures and scripting languages and have proved their competence in Digital Humanities in an independently conducted project. Their secondary subject is supplemented by insights into two further subjects in the fields of arts or culture sciences.
