## **Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives**

The course pursues the goal of laying the foundations of the subject by scientific study of German language and literature. The studies in German cover these individual points:

- An overview of the history of German literature from the beginnings to the present in the context of the history of European literature, thought and culture
- Fundamentals of evaluation and mediation of literary texts on methodical principles
- Basic knowledge of current and historical theories of literature
- Basic knowledge in the fundamental disciplines rhetoric, poetics/aesthetics, narratology
- Awareness of the problems of a scientific fixing of terminology (epochs, genres, methodologies)
- Competence in reading and translating earlier forms of German
- · Awareness of the problem of alterity in medieval literature
- Ability to reflect on literary texts in their artificiality and historical context
- Ability to delineate appropriately contextual relationships in both oral and written forms and using relevant media to present them suitably to a target group
- Fundamental knowledge of the different systematic levels of the German language (phonetics/phonology, graphematics, morphology, syntax, semantics, pragmatics)
- An overview of the most important historical lines of development in the German language in both the German language (Old High German, Middle High German, Early Modern High German) and in relation to historical sectional views of tendencies in phonetics/phonology, graphematics, morphology, syntax, semantics and pragmatics
- Developing an awareness of question complexes, investigational methods and theoretical approaches in linguistics
- Basic knowledge of the most important research paradigms in current German linguistics
- Ability to recognise, analyse and reflect on present-day use of language in its various manifestations in the media with the help of a pool of linguistic methods
- Ability to recognise historical texts, to place them chronologically, geographically and socially and to reflect appropriately on their source situation with the help of the available methods of historical linguistics

Within the lecture, this module aims to provide an overview of the development of the German language from its beginnings to the present. Not only covers the module the German language history, but also processes of language change on the different levels of the language system. This course aims to put the acquired knowledge from the lecture - particularly concerning historical grammar- into practice and consolidate these skills on genuine texts from Old High German to Modern High German (with focus on Middle High German and Early Modern High German texts).

Students possess basic knowledge of the development of the German language from its beginnings up to the present. They are able to identify and analyse grammatical phenomena in texts of different language levels assuredly.

One of the following sub-modules must be chosen. The sub-module EDP-Philology gives an overview of the discipline of digital humanities, the imparting of fundamental methods of digital humanities - abstraction, formalisation - and their use in the data modelling. Additionally, the module gives an overview of principles of the text encoding and relevant encoding systems (e.g. TEI) and design of digital editions, corpora and information systems as well as an overview of typical application methods of digital humanities in the humanities. The sub-module media gives an overview of the mediality of language and literature in a synchronic and diachronic view, particularly of the competition of different media (orality/textuality), the media change (e.g. handwriting/printing) and the consequences of mediality on the methods of literary production and reception.

#### **Intended learning outcomes**

Concerning the sub-module EDP philology: Students are able to use chosen methods of digital humanities in the humanities. Concerning the sub-module media: Students know how to deal with different media. They are able to describe and explain the media change and to analyse media appropriately.
