Course of Studies - Contents and Objectives

The qualification Magister or Magistra Theologiae is a canonical degree as defined in the Apostolic Constitution "Sapientia Christiana" of April 29, 1976, in connection with "Accommodation decree I" of January 1, 1983, introduction, par. 2.

Graduates qualify for the tasks

- of a Roman Catholic priest both as a diocesan priest and as a priest in a religious order,
- of professional employments in the Church, e.g. as a pastoral assistant or as a teacher of religious education, and in various spheres of ecclesiastic activity, as religious instruction in youth or adult education and catechetics, Church administration or government,
- in theological research and the teaching of theology at University level.

The programme concerned is a full course of theological studies ["Theologisches Vollstudium"] characterized as a "One-subject-, five-years-, 300 ECTS-points-course" in accordance with "Basic points for the structure of degree courses involving Catholic or Protestant theology/religion [Eckpunkte für die Studienstruktur in Studiengängen mit Katholischer oder Evangelischer Theologie/Religion]" as determined by the Conference of Secretaries of Education to the German States in 2007-12-13 [Beschluss der Kultusministerkonferenz vom 13.12.2007]. This programme comprises two successive segments. First segment, semesters 1 through 6. In this first part of their studies, students will have acquired a basic knowledge of biblical, historical, systematic and practical theology, as well as philosophy. They will also have gained the methodical tools for a independent and critical approach to their academic work. Second segment, semesters 7 through 10. Graduates will have consolidated this knowledge of the entire area of theology and philosophy, specializing in parts of it. They will have gained the skills prerequisite for their professional work on an academic basis as well as the expertise and competence required for independent theological research.

Both segments of the programme will have been accompanied by internships and further specific training to prepare graduates for the practical challenges of their profession.



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Discussion of, and reflection upon, the theological self-understanding of the Church from the point of view of systematic theology based on New Testament ecclesiologies and their metaphors of the Church as the Body of Christ, the People of God, or the House of God. A particular focus will be on the ecclesiology of the Second Vatican Council. Discussion of the historical development of ecclesiology and the constitutional law of the Latin Church to give students a clear picture of the Church.

Intended learning outcomes

At the end of the course, students will have become familiar with different models of ecclesiology. They will be able to critically reflect upon different ecclesial realities and take their own well-founded position on them. Students will have developed a critical awareness of the fact that our understanding of the Church is shaped not only by our theoretical knowledge, but also by our actions.



At the end of the course, students will have gained an insight into the richness of Christian piety and the diverse ways in which Christians live and lived their faith. They will know how they originated and will have become aware of the fact that they arose from prevailing circumstances. Students will have developed an awareness of the fact that the Church today is operating in a society that is characterised by diversity and will have become familiar with relevant norms. In addition, students will have developed the ability to make use of the tensions between norms and situations to spark their own theological and practical creativity.



The structures of Christian behaviour in society and the principles that underlie it. Discussion of individual and institutional behaviour from the point of view of faith. An introduction to institutions, such as the human rights, in which Christian responsibility to society manifests. Discussion of the principles of the law regulating the relationship between the Church and the state (*Staatskirchenrecht*) that underlie Christian behaviour in the state and society.

Intended learning outcomes

At the end of the course, students will have become familiar with standard models for the constitution and justification of ethical norms and will know how faith influences ethical behaviour. They will have become familiar with the foundations of Christian social ethics and will have developed an awareness of issues surrounding human rights. In addition, they will have become familiar with the legal principles that underlie Christian behaviour in the state and society. They will be able to identify and solve fundamental problems in ethics, social ethics, and the law regulating the relationship between the Church and the state.

Contents						

Looking at different approaches to teaching religious education, the section on religious education discusses key problems in the subject in a multicultural and multireligious context. The section on pastoral theology reflects upon the process of an individual's becoming a Christian and the way it impacts upon his/her biography; a particular focus is on the influence of the milieu in which an individual lives. The section on social ethics discusses human behaviour and the dimensions of socio-ethical education. The individual module components all share the theme of exploring aspects relating to the process of becoming and being a Christian.

Intended learning outcomes

At the end of the course, students will have learned to think of being a Christian as a multidimensional process. They will have gained deeper insights into the religious development of individuals and will be able to interrelate it with the contemporary cultural and social environment. They will have become familiar with approaches to supporting the processes individuals are undergoing in their religious development, processes that expose individuals to the richness of Christian tradition, warrant freedom and individuality, and view the social context as a welcome challenge.

What sets the Catholic theology programme offered by the University of Würzburg apart from programmes offered by other institutions is that it offers deeper insights into regional and eastern church history and also covers topics in ecumenical theology and missiology. 

Theological anthropology and the doctrine of creation. Old and New Testament foundations and their development in theological tradition. The *Schöpfungstheologie* (Theology of Creation) lecture is dogmatically oriented and discusses the concept of the world as the creation of God in the context of topical interdisciplinary problems and trinitarian theories; in addition, it provides a systematic analysis of the related Christian understanding of the human person. The systematic opinions and definitions of Christian tradition are discussed in the context of modern natural and human sciences and the implications for our need to take responsibility for human life considered.

Intended learning outcomes

At the end of the course, students will have developed the ability to distinguish between different biblical views of creation and the human person and to situate them within a context. They will have become familiar with the key structural elements of the Christian understanding of the world and the human person. Students will be able to reflect upon issues in philosophy and the natural sciences in contemporary interdisciplinary debate in the context of the trinitarian doctrine of creation. In addition, students will be familiar with how we as Christians have to take responsibility for human life in the face of the challenges posed by medicine and biotechnology.





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Discussion of biblical foundations with special attention to Old Testament Messianic texts as well as New Testament texts about the life and works of Jesus of Nazareth. Investigation of problems in early church relating to the faith in Jesus Christ as the Saviour and the Lord, including but not limited to questions about the oneness and the plurality of God and the relationship between God and humankind in Jesus Christ; discussion of the historical development of the debate during the first five centuries AD. Discussion of christology as a reflection on the centre and source of Christian faith in today's religiously plural world; an introduction to the historical Jesus and the Christ of faith.

Students will be able to critically reflect upon topical issues and take their own well-founded position on them.


